We believe no one should be turned away due to financial constraints. Therefore, we need to build our campership fund.



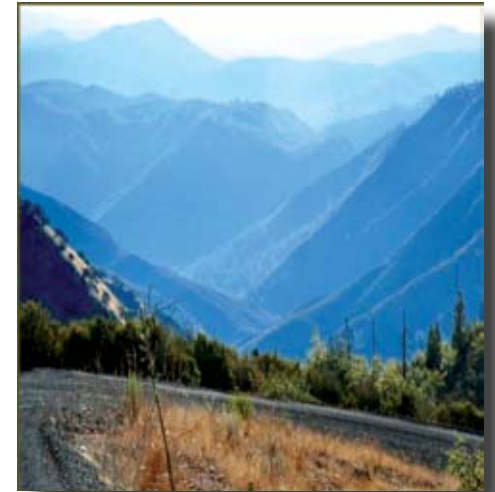

Tuolumne Trails is built on 80 scenic acres of Sierra Nevada wilderness seven miles east of Groveland, CA, near the grandeur of Yosemite National Park.



The camp is located off Highway 120 on Ferretti Road, and is surrounded on three sides by national forest. It is only three miles from the Pine Mountain Lake Airport, should emergency medical transport be required.

Camp Tuolumne Trails is dedicated to providing an enriching and fun camp experience in a facility especially designed and built for children with special medical needs.

Facilities and Activities

All facilities at Tuolumne Trails are wheelchair accessible. There are six bunkhouses for children and counselors, plus two bath houses. The Great Hall is the heart of the camp; it houses the kitchen, dining room, infirmary, offices, arts and crafts center, and rooms for large and small group activities. Outdoor facilities include a fully accessible swimming pool, large playing field, hiking and wheelchair trails, fishing pond and stargazing site.



Campers

Campers come from California and Nevada in groups organized by local agencies: Watch Resources, Juvenile Diabetes, Muscular Dystrophy Association, Stockton Diocese, Easter Seals, Cerebral Palsy family camps, and many others.

Danny lost his sight at one week of age. He experiences the world through his hands. This summer Danny was able to experience the textures of nature in a safe, friendly environment.

Whether roasting marshmallows over a fire, feeding ducks by the pond, spending the afternoon in the pool or exploring camp in his chair, for a few days Nicky was just a kid having fun.

The Jackson family had never experienced a family vacation before. At Tuolumne Trails the whole family could enjoy the simple pleasures of a week in the mountains regardless of the physical abilities of one of their children. Mom and Dad even found time for a moonlight walk while camp staff watched the kids.
